Clinical features The clinical picture of acne can vary considerably from a few mild lesions on the face to widespread, inflamed lesions affecting the face, chest and upper back (Figure 1, p164) The clinical features comprise comedones (whiteheads and blackheads), papules, pustules and nodules appearing over the face, upper chest and back
