Enjoyment of Mediated Fright and Violence: A Meta-Analysis

Fright and violence have been featured in film and television since the early days of these media. For example, *The Cabinet of Dr Caligari* (Pommer & Wiene, 1919) is viewed as a classic of cinematic horror, and the television series *Alfred Hitchcock Presents* (Hitchcock, 1955–1962) focused on “stories of terror, horror, suspense” (Brooks & Marsh, 1988, p 24)

The *Alfred Hitchcock Mystery Magazine*, founded in 1956, remains a favored publication for crime writers to see their work. Linda Landrigan, editor of the magazine, said many writers submitting stories were fans of “*Alfred Hitchcock Presents*,” a TV series from the 1950s that ...
